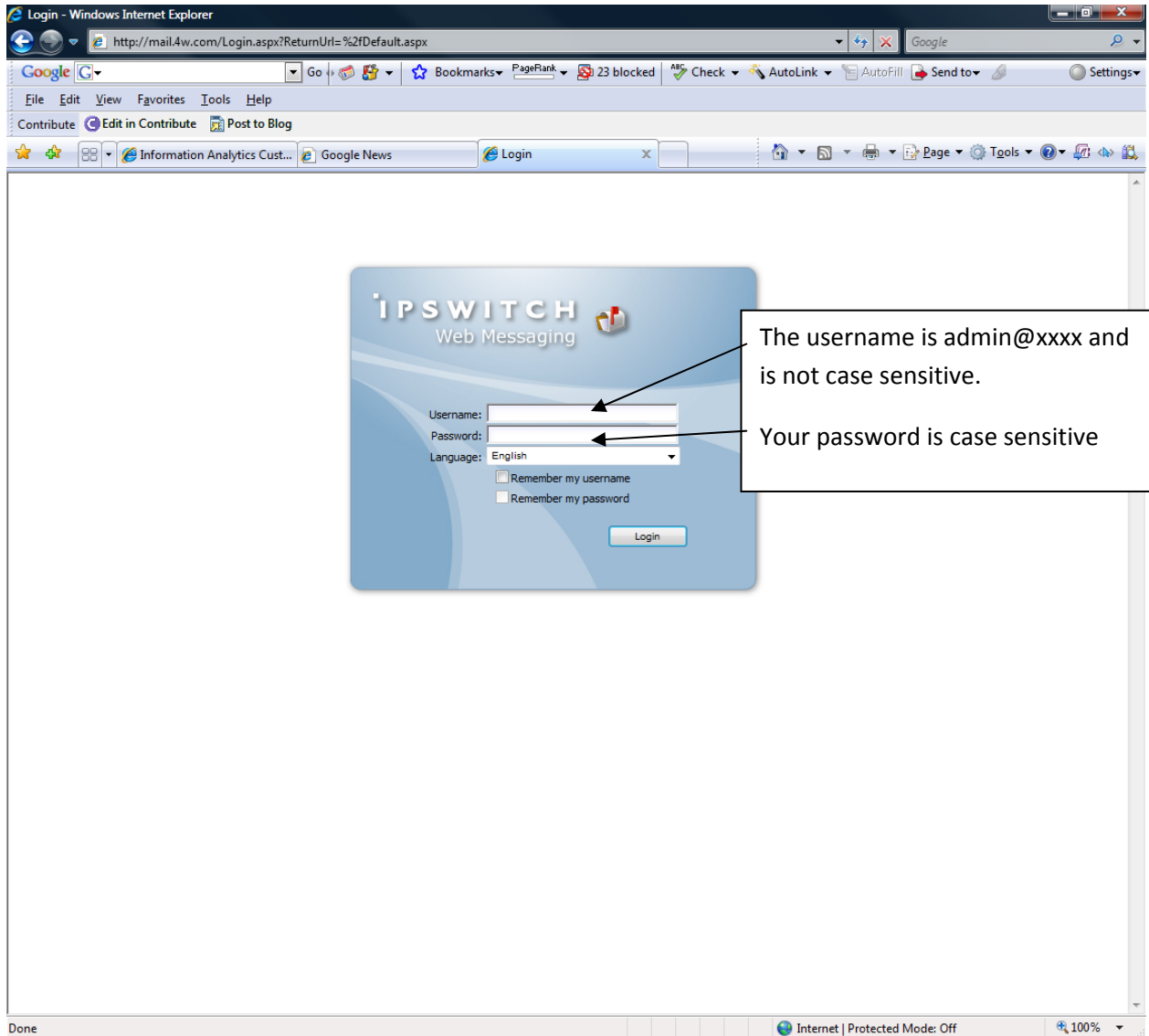


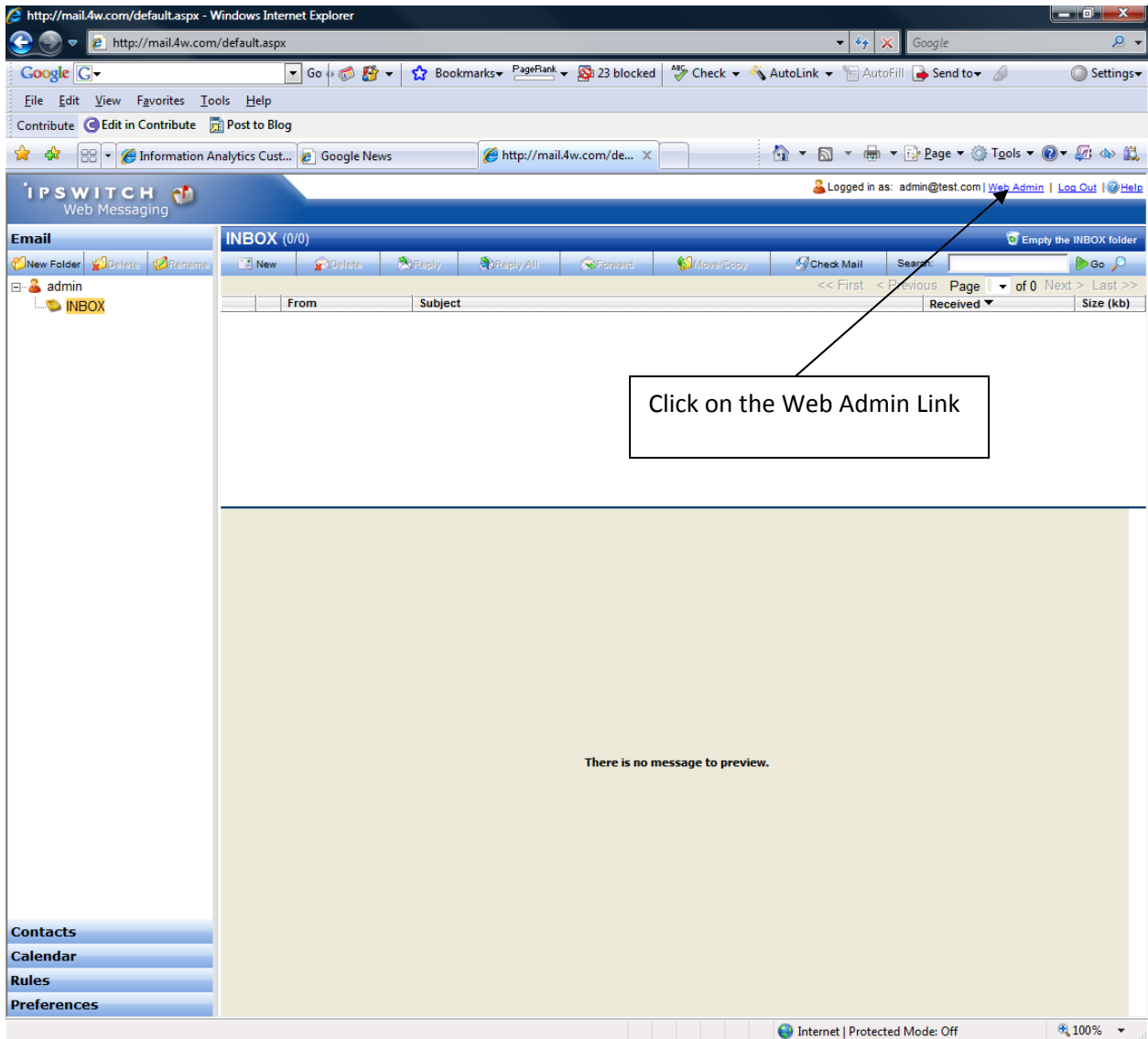
IEmail Administration – adding new users for your domain
